Once it is reasonably apparent to CJA counsel that the cost of representation for a defendant will likely exceed 150 attorney hours (or \$24,600 based on the current CJA rate of \$164/hour), the court may request development of a complete or staged budget for the defendant's representation. Budgeting is accomplished with the assistance of the CJA Supervising Attorney. Cases that will likely exceed 300 hours (\$49,200) may require consultation with the Ninth Circuit's Case Budgeting Attorney. Budgeting is mandatory for capital cases and cases expected to exceed \$100,000 in combined costs.
