14 The present bail for unlawful hunting, fishing, and possession
15 or use of firearms in the Mill Creek Watershed is \$20.00. This
16 partial closure of the area to hunting or fishing without a per-
17 mit arises from the authority given the Forest Supervisor under
18 36 CFR 251.25. The violator is cited under 36 CFR 261.11(j),
19 which refers to 36 CFR 251.25. At the present time, the bail
20 schedule of April, 1975, provides for a \$20.00 fine for violation
21 of 36 CFR 261.11(j).

22 Under 36 CFR 251.25, the Forest Supervisor may not order a
23 complete closure of an area. Nos. 74-2809, 74-2965, 74-3062,
24 75-1019, 20, 21, 22. (9th Cir. 1976). The Mill Creek Watershed
25 is only partially closed to hunting fishing, and possession or
26 use of firearms without a permit by authority of the Forest
27 Supervisor.

28 An increase in the bail from \$20.00 to \$100.00 would provide
29 a greater deterrent to unlawful activity. At the present time
30 it is well work the risk of a \$20.00 fine to unlawfully hunt and
31 fish in the area. This is especially true when the result of
32 an unlawful hunt may be an elk. In the Mill Creek Watershed,



1 a certain number of permits are issued each year to regulate the
2 killing of a protected herd. However, several elk are taken
3 without permits each year. The increased \$100.00 fine will
4 decrease the illegal hunting or fishing in the area.



**INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE OF
THE "SCHEDULE"**

For certain Federal misdemeanors and infraction charges listed in the "Schedule," defendants in the Eastern District of Washington have the option to pay a fixed sum to the Clerk of Court instead of appearing in court. If a defendant makes such a payment timely, that amount is forfeited; defendant need not appear in court; and the case is closed. *See* Fed. R. Crim. P. 58(d)(1); 18 U.S.C. § 3571(b); Local Mag. R. 2(c).

The Court has adopted this "Schedule" listing all misdemeanor offenses and infractions for which a defendant has that option and also listing all infractions and misdemeanors that require a mandatory appearance. An officer who issues a citation or violation notice should be certain how the offense charged is treated in the "Schedule":

(a) If the "Schedule" provides a dollar amount of bail for the offense in question, that amount must be entered in the box at the lower right on the citation or Violation Notice.

NOTE: Neither the officer, or his superior, has discretion to vary from the provisions of the "Schedule" in a given case.

(b) If the offense is listed as "Mandatory," the charge is not one which can be resolved for forfeiting a specified amount, and the defendant must appear in court when directed, i.e., when notified to appear by the Central Violations Bureau (CVB) in San Antonio, Texas.

(c) IF THE OFFENSE IS NOT LISTED IN THE "SCHEDULE," A CITATION OR VIOLATION NOTICE SHOULD NOT BE ISSUED. If the officer or agency believes prosecution is appropriate for unlisted violations, the matter should be referred to the Petty Offense Section of the United States Attorney's Office, 920 West Riverside, Suite 320, Spokane, Washington 99210, telephone number (509) 353-2767.

Authority for the adoption of the "Schedule" is based upon Rule 58(d) of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure, Title 18 of the United States Code Section 3571(b), and Local Magistrate Rule 2(c). In the Eastern District of Washington, although the Magistrate Judges preside over petty offense cases and their impute regarding the adoption of the Schedule is encouraged, there is not a local rule which authorizes the full-time United States Magistrate Judges to adopt or amend the "Schedule." Therefore, the "Schedule" must be approved by the District Court Judges for the Eastern District of Washington.

Suggested modifications or additions to the "Schedule" and questions about its use should be presented in writing to the AUSA in charge of the Petty Offense Section, United States Attorney's Office, United States Attorney's Office, 920 West Riverside, Suite 320, Spokane, Washington 99210, telephone number (509) 353-2767.

Amendments consisting of new or substitute pages will be distributed by the United States Attorney's Office as they are made by the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Washington from time to time. Each office or agency is responsible for making its officers or agents aware of all relevant changes and for maintaining a current copy of the "Schedule."

Under Federal law, a felony is an offense punishable by death or imprisonment for a term exceeding one year. No felonies are listed in the "Schedule." A CITATION OR VIOLATION NOTICE SHOULD NEVER BE WRITTEN FOR A FELONY.

Under Federal law, a Misdemeanor is any offense punishable by imprisonment not exceeding one year. Within the Misdemeanor definition, there are now three classes of Misdemeanors:

Class A Misdemeanors: An offense that has a maximum imprisonment of one (1) year, but more than six (6) months.

Class B Misdemeanors: An offense that has a maximum imprisonment of six (6) months, but more than thirty (30) days.

Class C Misdemeanors: An offense that has a maximum imprisonment of thirty (30) days, but more than five (5) days.

Under Federal law, a Petty Offense is an offense for which the maximum period of imprisonment does not exceed six (6) months. Class B misdemeanors, Class C misdemeanors and Infractions would come under the "Petty Offense" category.

Under Federal law, an Infraction is an offense that has a maximum of five (5) days or less, or no imprisonment authorized.

The specific offense that is charged will have a maximum term of imprisonment which will then tell you whether it is a Misdemeanor, Petty Offense, or an Infraction.

The maximum fines for federal offenses are as follows:

Class A Misdemeanors: Not more than \$100,000.00

Class B Misdemeanors: Not more than \$5,000.00

Class C Misdemeanors: Not more than \$5,000.00

Infraction: Not more than \$5,000.00

These maximum fine amounts only apply to federal offenses, like those found in Title 18, Title 16, and the CFR's. These maximum fine amounts do not apply to state offenses.

State offenses which are assimilated under the Assimilated Crimes Act, 18 U.S.C. § 13, are not subject to the next maximum federal fines. The maximum imprisonment and fine that is set by the State Statute applies when an offense is assimilated into the federal system. Under the Assimilated Crimes Act, an offense in Washington State charging a:
