



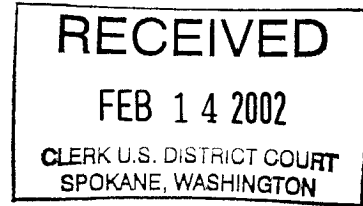

12 The proposed schedule of collateral forfeiture for the Department of  
13 Veterans Affairs in the Eastern District of Washington is submitted pursuant to  
14 Fed. R. Crim. P. 58(d)(1).

15 The schedule is similar in scope and effect to those presently enforced within  
16 similar judicial districts. Implementation of the collateral forfeiture system upon  
17 Department of Veterans Affairs facilities and lands will insure consistent and  
18 uniform enforcement of applicable rules and regulations upon all federal lands  
19 within the Eastern District of Washington. This collateral forfeiture system is  
20 similar to that of the National Park Service and United States Forest Service.  
21 Enforcement will also create the desired deterrent effect on possible violators and  
22 lead to the continued protection and preservation of Veterans Affairs facilities and  
23 lands.


24 All collateral forfeiture bail amounts are equal to or less than those specified  
25 in the corresponding C.F.R.'s with the following exceptions: 38 C.F.R. §§  
26 1.218(b)(5), (15), (18), (37), and (38) have been converted to mandatory
