The proposed schedule of collateral forfeiture for the Department of Veterans Affairs in the Eastern District of Washington is submitted pursuant to Fed. R. Crim. P. 58(d)(1).

The schedule is similar in scope and effect to those presently enforced within similar judicial districts. Implementation of the collateral forfeiture system upon Department of Veterans Affairs facilities and lands will insure consistent and uniform enforcement of applicable rules and regulations upon all federal lands within the Eastern District of Washington. This collateral forfeiture system is similar to that of the National Park Service and United States Forest Service. Enforcement will also create the desired deterrent effect on possible violators and lead to the continued protection and preservation of Veterans Affairs facilities and lands.

All collateral forfeiture bail amounts are equal to or less than those specified in the corresponding C.F.R.'s with the following exceptions: 38 C.F.R. §§ 1.218(b)(5), (15), (18), (37), and (38) have been converted to mandatory
