IN RE: PROCEDURES FOR THE FILING OF SEALED DOCUMENTS

AMENDED GENERAL ORDER NO. 2025-13

In an August 7, 2025, press release, the Administrative Office of the United States Courts announced a requirement for advanced measures to further strengthen protections and secure the integrity of sensitive case documents in the official court record. On August 8, 2025, the Court entered General Order No. 2025-13, establishing the requirement for all sealed and ex parte documents to be filed in paper format at the clerk's offices of the Eastern District of Washington.

THE COURT FINDS that while the national CM/ECF system remains impacted, the local development of a Federal Information Security Management Act (FISMA) compliant secure file transfer protocol obviates the need for registered users of the Court's CM/ECF system to file sealed and ex parte documents in paper format with the clerk's offices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that effective December 5, 2025,

GENERAL ORDER No. 2025-13 AMENDED

- 1. Registered users of the Court's CM/ECF system shall submit all sealed and ex parte documents to be filed in the Eastern District of Washington's criminal and civil cases to the clerk's office via the Court's public website's *WAEDocument Portal*, a FISMA compliant secure file transfer protocol vehicle.
- 2. Pro se litigants who are not registered users of the Court's CM/ECF system shall continue to file all sealed and ex parte documents in the Eastern District of Washington's criminal and civil cases in paper format at the clerk's office filing/intake counters in the Richland, Spokane or Yakima United States Courthouses. The filings and wet signature requirements of conventional paper filings in Rule 5 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure shall apply.
- 3. Due to the current inability to upload non-public documents into the national CM/ECF system, the service requirements of conventional paper filings in Rule 5 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure shall apply to all filers.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that there will remain no electronic access to sealed documents other than by court staff.

The District Court Executive is directed to enter this Order provide copies to the United States Attorney's Office, the Federal Defenders of Eastern Washington and Idaho, Criminal Justice Act panel attorneys, the Federal Bar Association for

2	copy. The District Court Executive is further directed to amend the Eastern
3	District of Washington's ECF Administrative Procedures to comport with this
4	General Order.
