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6 COURT OPERATIONS UNDER THE EXIGENT CIRCUMSTANCES
7 CREATED BY THE CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) GENERAL ORDER NO. 20-101-4

This General Order is being issued pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2071(e) and in 9 10 response to the evolving public health crisis caused by the outbreak of the 11 Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19). In response to the continued spread of COVID-12 19, President Trump has declared a national emergency and issued guidelines 13 directing at-risk individuals, including those 60 and older, to stay home and away 14 from other people, and encouraging everyone to work from home whenever 15 possible, to avoid discretionary travel, and to avoid social gatherings in groups of 16 more than ten people. Washington State Governor Inslee has declared a state of 17 emergency, and on March 23, 2020, he issued a "stay at home" order that requires Washington residents to stay home unless they need to pursue an essential activity, 18 19 bans all social, religious, and recreational gatherings, and closed all businesses 20 except essential businesses. The Court finds it necessary in the interest of justice to

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take proactive measures to slow the spread of the virus and ensure the safety of litigants, counsel, Court staff, grand jurors, petit jurors, witnesses, and the public.

This Order supersedes General Order Nos. 20-101-1 and 20-101-2. Accordingly, **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that, effective immediately:

1. All hearings in civil and criminal cases scheduled for in-court appearance before any District Judge in the Eastern District of Washington through **May 15, 2020**, are VACATED, subject to Orders from the presiding judge in each of those cases. All associated case management deadlines related to those affected civil and criminal cases are SUSPENDED, subject to Orders from the presiding judge in each of those cases;

All grand jury sessions through May 15, 2020 are VACATED.
 Determinations of excludable delay for the time period in which to file an Indictment will be made in each individual case according to 18 U.S.C. § 3161(b) and (h);

3. As to pending criminal cases, the Court finds, given the outbreak of the COVID-19, that rescheduling in-person hearings set in the near future would result in minimizing undue risk to defendants, counsel, law enforcement, Court staff, grand jurors, petit jurors, witnesses, and the public at large. The Court also finds current public health advisories reduce the Court's ability to obtain an adequate spectrum of jurors and curtails the

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availability of counsel and Court staff to be present in the courtroom. Therefore, the Court finds, based on the widespread nature of the risks posed by COVID-19, that the ends of justice served by resetting hearings in all pending criminal cases during this period outweigh the best interest of the public and each affected defendant in speedy trials, and the period between the date of entry of this Order and **May 15, 2020**, may be excluded from Speedy Trial Act calculations. *See* 18 U.S.C. § 3161(h)(7)(A). Findings of excludable delay will be contemporaneously entered by the presiding judge in each individual case, along with an amended scheduling order;

4. Counsel need not object to this General Order to preserve any issues for litigation, including an alleged violation of a client's constitutional rights, as objections will be required in each individual case;

5. Excepted from this General Order are essential Magistrate Judge hearings and functions which will be evaluated on a case-by case basis at the discretion of the presiding Magistrate Judge after consultation with counsel;
6. Hearings in civil or criminal matters set for telephonic appearance by all parties or hearings set without oral argument are not affected by this General Order;

7. The Clerk's Office in each of the three court locations will not be physically accessible to the public, but will remain open. Staff will be

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available by telephone, mail will be received, and new filings will be processed. Those seeking to make in-person filings or payments are directed to leave such materials in designated drop-boxes at the Court Security Officer locations (guard stations) in the entryway of each courthouse. The Court encourages electronic filings made through the CM/ECF filing system, use of the electronic payment system, and use of mail and delivery services. The Clerk's Office is not closed, it is operational, and you may contact the office by telephone during business hours;

8. The United States Probation and Pretrial Service Office in each of the three court locations will be closed to the general public. Staff will be available by telephone and drug testing and supervision will continue as directed by Probation and Pretrial Service officers;

9. STEP Court participants will be advised separately when they are to appear for proceedings;

10. Naturalization Ceremonies are CANCELLED through May 15, 2020.The Citizen and Immigration Service (CIS) is authorized to administer the oath of Citizenship during this period of time;

11. Physical access to proceedings scheduled during this time are limited to persons required and necessarily allowed to attend as directed by the presiding judge, which include parties, counsel, witnesses, and victims. If

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the courtroom is not open to the public or press, the live audio content of the 1 hearing will be available in real-time to members of the public and press, via 2 a dedicated teleconference line. Dial-in information will be available on the 3 PACER system in the docket of each scheduled case that does not allow 4 public access. 5 recorded or rebroadcast; and 6 This Order does not pertain to Bankruptcy proceedings. Please consult 7 12. or contact the Bankruptcy Court for information and specific directions. 8 The public is encouraged to use online Court resources, contact the 9 Court/Clerk's Office by telephone, and continue utilizing Court services while 10 following all applicable public health guidelines. 11 The District Court Executive is directed to post this General Order to the 12 Court's website and distribute a copy to each attorney registered in the CM/ECF 13 system and each pro se litigant with a case pending before this Court. 14 This Order is subject to public comment by directing all concerns to the 15 District Court Executive. 16
